Overall, Major and Meredith GPAs of 2.0 are required to graduate. 124 hours are required to graduate. 155 hours are required for those earning two different bachelors' degrees (e.g. a BS and a BA). In addition, 24 of the last 30 hours must be taken at Meredith. $50 \%$ of major and minor requirements for all programs are required to be taken at Meredith. For transfer students, at least 31 hours must be completed at Meredith and at least 60 hours must be taken at regionally accredited four-year institutions. In addition to college requirements, hours toward graduation may be filled with electives chosen based on student interest.
