



OUTCOMES – EDUCATING WOMEN TO EXCEL

GRADUATION RATES

Meredith College is pleased to report graduation statistics for the students who entered as *full-time, first-time freshmen* in Fall 2007. In compliance with the Student Right-to-Know (SRTK) Act of 1990, the report reflects the percentage of students who complete within six years (150% of the normal time to completion). However, it is significant to note that most Meredith graduates do not take six years to earn their baccalaureate degrees. Meredith has also chosen to report its four-year and five-year average graduation rates for full-time, first-time students.
