Journey Highlights

The program begins in the heart of London, in beautiful Regents Park. You will find an almost overwhelming variety of opportunities in theatre, music, dance, art, museums, and historic sites, including a tour of Parliament. Four weeks in London will not seem long enough for all the experiences you can have!

Mornings will find you engaged in classes. The rest of most days and weekends are free for sightseeing, independent travel, and of course, study. This is a rigorous academic experience. You will be required to take six credit hours. Independent study and honors contracts may be available in some areas, but at an extra cost if taught by other faculty.

One long weekend break while in London allow you to travel independently! And if you don't want to leave Great Britain, you could scarcely do better than a few days in Edinburgh, Scotland; beautiful York; or the Lake District. Or stay in London and enjoy day trips from there. The options are almost endless!

BIO 949: Scientific Expeditions: London (3 credits)

Fulfills Math/Science Elective, Biology major/minor Elective

London is the setting of some of the most important discoveries in science. This course is designed to expose students to the scientific locations, personalities, and ideas originating from England, and how they have shaped the culture, politics and outlook of modern UK society. Best of all, you get to plan the science lover's week in London!

Cost

\$5,950 includes:

- \$100 non-refundable application deposit
- Tuition for 6 credits
- Accommodations in London
- Full-board (breakfast, lunch, and dinner except Saturday nights)
- Academic excursions to Bath, Windsor, the Houses of Parliament, and St. Paul's Cathedral
- Transfers from and to the airport

Additional expenses include:

- Round-trip airfare \$1,750
- Passport (if needed) \$150
- International health insurance \$92

- International cell phone plan \$150
- Independent travel \$500-\$1000
- Personal spending money \$500-\$3000
