Dramaturgy Note

Fun, Laughs, and Good Times

Underneath the bright, bombastic world of Cy Coleman and Neil Simon's Sweet Charity lies a very poignant slice-of-life story of our main heroine Charity. Charity Hope Valentine is a dance hall hostess of the fictional Fandango Ballroom, another word for this being 'taxi dancer.' Taxi dancing - getting its name from how taxi drivers are paid on a per-person basis - was a system in the 1920s in which women would attract male patrons to come dance with them for a commission. The makeup of these dancers included financially struggling women who were runaways or came from broken homes, and in some cases, were the sole providers of their families outside the dance hall. These concepts are reflected in one of the musical's most popular songs "Big Spender." The mechanical, bored, and practiced tone of the song demonstrates how this life is just a way to pay the bills for these women, 'paying the rent' being a slang term for carrying out a secret relationship in a taxi dance hall. The lyrics promise 'fun, laughs, and good times' to the refined, distinct men who have entered the dance hall, ready to spend their money on the first woman who catches their eye: To the men, this is another Saturday night, but to the women, this is their lives. In "There's Gotta be Something Better Than This," the women sing about a better, cleaner life in which their idealized life is...a typical 9–5.

Dramaturgy Note

On a lighter note, the 1960s were a big push for women. With second-wave feminism on the rise in the early 60s, a lot of changes swept over America. In 1961, the combined oral contraceptive pill was approved by the FDA a year prior, and made it easier for women to pursue jobs. The Feminine Mystique, Betty Friedan's book critiquing the nuclear family and women's domestic role, was published in '63. (Note: Although Friedan's book was revolutionary for its time, it also excluded the experiences of women of color, queer women, non-married women, and working class women). Another landmark of the 1960s was Hippie culture, the counterculture of the day. Hippie culture embraced the sexual revolution which sought to normalize the use of contraception, pornography, premarital sex, and other non-heteronormative conventions; it is mostly remembered for the liberal use of marijuana and LSD.

In the musical, Charity is far from the ideal woman by domestic pre-1960s standards: She's an unmarried woman who goes from man to man. However, it is important to note that the text never treats this part of Charity as something to be sensationalized or demonized; it is a challenge but it is part of her life. In the film *Sweet Charity: The Adventures of a Girl Who Wanted to Be Loved*, two endings were created: one where Charity got with Oscar after he accepts her past and one where Oscar leaves Charity because he can't get past the fact that she has been with so many men before him. Bob Fosse, the original director of both the film

and the stage play as well as the choreographer, had filmed both endings just in case a happier ending was demanded of him...the latter is the ending that sticks.

Despite the fun musical numbers, plucky main lead who literally wears her heart on her sleeve, and fosse dance numbers, this musical is a look into the life of a woman trying to overcome the odds and looking for something a lot of us take for granted.
